VOTER REGISTRATION

ELECTION SECURITY




A Salt Lake County resident registers to vote either online or using a paper form.



Their identity is verified through the State of Utah using the last four digits of their social security number, their Utah driver license number, or a state ID card number.



A record is created for the voter in Utah's statewide voter registration database.



A Voter Information Card (VIC) with the voter's precinct and district information is mailed to the voter.

MAINTAINING ACCURATE VOTER ROLLS



Election staff review all returned mail to verify the accuracy of voters' addresses and voter status.



Notifications from other states identify voters who have moved out-of-state.



The National Change of Address (NCOA) database is used to update voter addresses.



Address changes made with the Utah Driver License Division (DLD) are automatically applied.



Voters are encouraged to contact the Election Division when they move.



Deceased persons are regularly removed based on a list provided by the Office of Vital Records



The database is scanned regularly to remove duplicate entries and ensure accuracy.
