- Review uncounted ballot envelopes under <u>20A 3a part 4</u>. These ballots remain unopened during the review:
  - $\square$  Review all uncounted mail ballots that were challenged (20A-3a-401(3)).
  - Review all cured affidavits to ensure each corresponding ballot has been counted (20A-3a-401(5)).
  - ☑ Ballots that were not cured before 5:00 pm three days before the original canvass began cannot be counted (20A-3a-401(5)).
  - Review all uncounted provisional ballots (20A-3a-402(1)).
