CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at approximately 7:30 AM by Dan Eckersley, Chair of the Salt Lake County Board of Health.

CITIZEN PUBLIC COMMENT:

Comments are limited to 3 minutes unless otherwise approved by the Salt Lake County Board of Health. There were no public comments.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Dan Eckersley notified the Board that the interview process has started in the search for an executive director for the Health Department.

Dan Eckersley reminded the Board that the Annual Symposium for the Local Boards of Health will be on April 17th and 18th at Thanksgiving Point. He encouraged all board members to attend. A registration link was sent by email.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Dorothy Adams, the interim director of the Salt Lake County Health Department, gave the Director's Report.

Fiscal Manager

Dorothy informed the Board that the department is in the final stages of the fiscal manager interviews. The department is hoping the decision will be made early next week. Dorothy thanked Yanping Ding, with human services, for her help with department fiscal needs during this search.

Measles Update

Dorothy informed the department that Measles has now affected 17 areas of the country. The Health Department has activated their ICS (Incident Command Structure) in the Measles preventative response. The department exercises ICS as often as possible so in an emergency the response is seamless. The department is looking at ways to access more MMR vaccine to assist getting the vaccine to more vulnerable populations. There is currently no measles outbreak in Salt Lake County.

Regulations 6 & 9

Dorothy informed the board that there were non substantive changes that needed to be made to the regulations before opening public comment. Those changes were made, and public comment will be opened.

June Budget Adjustments

The department is working on June budget adjustments. Most of the adjustments are relevant to grants that have been received that were not put in the 2024 budget. One major requested increase will be in the immunizations due to the 50% increase in vaccines given compared to the 1st quarter in 2023.
