Who We Are

- Salt Lake County is the governmental body that oversees the unincorporated portions of the county and supports the 21 local governments (cities) within the geographical boundaries
- Salt Lake County has many departments, such as adult and aging services, County treasurer, Mayor's office, Etc.



Office of Regional Development

- One of the many offices at the County
- Includes different departments, such as
 - Regional Economic Development
 - Regional Planning and Transportation
 - Sustainability



Housing and Community Development

- Largest department in the Office of Regional Development
- Provides services through non-profit partners, private contractors, and directly to citizens
- Many different local, state, and federal programs and sources of funding



List of Terms

- **Low-Income**
 - \$92,400 per year for family of 4
- **Rehabilitation**
 - Repairs to a home or building
- **Rental Assistance**
 - Short term (Between 1 and 24 months) of paying portion of households rent



Healthy Homes and Lead Safe Team

- Provided directly to homeowners
- Focuses on owner-occupied households with seniors, children under 6, or those with chronic health conditions
- Provides rehabilitation of owner-occupied homes or entire apartment buildings to reduce health risks or correct safety issues

Other Homeowner Rehab Programs

- Housing and Community Development also provides funding to Assist Community Design Center, West Valley City, Midvale City, South Salt Lake, and Taylorsville City to provide low-income homeowner rehabilitation
- Funds only accessible through Assist Community Design Center and directly from cities



Rental Assistance

- Housing and Community Development provides funding to The Road Home, Utah Community Action, First Step House, and Housing Connect
- Rental assistance for low-income households who are at risk or experiencing homelessness
- Funds not provided directly by Salt Lake County. Each agency maintains own waitlist



Supportive Service Programs

- Housing and Community Developments provides a small amount of funding for projects that provide public and supportive services
- Funding provided to non-profits
- Programs vary from year to year depending on availability of funding

- Programs operated directly by non-profits
