With spring in the air, Salt Lake County is coming to life with activities for everyone to enjoy, engage, connect, and participate. This season brings a renewed focus on the programs, events, and initiatives that make Salt Lake County a vibrant place to live. In this month's newsletter, I am pleased to share updates on our ongoing efforts and upcoming opportunities for residents to get involved.

Legislative Session

During the 2025 Utah Legislative Session, Salt Lake County actively engaged in various initiatives to enhance the well-being of all residents. Among other issues, Salt Lake County:

- Advocated for environmental sustainability, supporting legislation to reduce harmful emissions and improve air quality during winter inversions.
- Championed infrastructure development, backing projects like the Midvalley Express bus rapid transit line to bolster public transportation and connectivity within the region.
- Focused on economic growth, with support for measures to revitalize the Salt Palace Convention Center and strengthen Salt Lake County's position as a hub for tourism and business.

These efforts underscore Salt Lake County's commitment to fostering a healthier, more connected, and economically vibrant future for all who live and work here.

Protect Yourself from Measles

Protect yourself and your loved ones from measles! This virus spreads very easily, even before symptoms appear. **Make sure you're protected with the MMR vaccine**, which is over 97% effective in preventing measles.

Vaccine recommendations vary:

- Children: 1st dose at 12-15 months, 2nd dose at 4-6 years
- Adults born before 1957 are generally already immune
- Adults vaccinated before 1968 may need a 2nd dose

Maintaining community immunity is crucial for at least 95% vaccination coverage. Check your immunization records and consult your healthcare provider. The MMR vaccine is widely available at local pharmacies, doctor's offices, or SLCoHD immunization clinics; call 385-468-SHOT to schedule a vaccination appointment at a health department clinic.
