00:00	Welcome from Jenny Wilson and Approval of Minutes
01:40	Judge Brendan McCullagh motioned to approve the August Minutes. Chief Matt Dumont second the motion. All were in favor.
02:30	HB206/Bail Reform: Implementation Update
02:51	Kesia Williams presented on the changes in pretrial decision making and processes as a result of HB206 implementation.
12:43	A discussion followed regarding criminal history risk scores and the criteria by which a judge would determine if someone is eligible for bail.

30:46	Mayor Jenny Wilson introduced the new seat member of CJAC: Luna Banuri . Luna works with diverse communities, specifically the Muslim community. She is a “recovering” attorney and appreciates the work the county is doing by creating a data driven metrics to guide equity and reform efforts.

33:28	Scott McMurtrey, Dyana Thurgood & Jess Schnedar presented . Justice Lab is a clinical law course at S.J. Quinney College of law, where students help to identify/solve legal, policy, and practical problems for community clients. Jojo reached out on the issue of lack ID’s keeping individuals from joining county programs. It is very difficult for homeless individuals to obtain identification and nearly 100% of them will have their identification stolen at some point. The Justice Lab is looking for solutions to help these individuals obtain and keep their identification. They are surveying the national landscape & will be presenting at the Dec. 9 th CJAC meeting with their findings.
