- 00:07 **Welcome from Councilmember Jim Bradley**
Associate Director Alexandra Allen welcomed the group and thanked Councilmember Jim Bradley for serving as the chair of CJAC for the last year. She also welcomed the new Chair Sheriff Rivera, and the new Vice Chair Mayor Wilson.
- 02:29 **Reminder to CJAC Members**
Disclosure statements are due for this year and will be handed out at the next meeting to be in compliance with state and county policy.
- 03:03 **Washington County Oregon Correctional Facility Trip Review**
Sheriff Riveria reviewed the recent trip to Oregon where many CJAC stake holders toured their facility. Alexandra Allen gave a summary of the trip. Thoughts and perspectives were given around the room surrounding the trip and ways to apply what was learned to SLCo.
- 16:20 **Systemic Coordination Review**
Mayor Wilson reviewed the goals of the Systemic Coordination planning happening and where they are in the process of identifying the gaps and needs within SLCo.
- 19:11 **Kelly Colopy Reviewed Supportive Housing Planning**
Kelly reviewed the data from the PIT Count and that there is an estimated 1,000 people experiencing homeless with 60% experiencing a mental illness. Reviewing this data to assess needs of this population. Looking at cost structures and plans to better serve this population. Will review data for the upcoming PIT count.
- Katherine Fife reviewed information from the past PIT Count and for the upcoming PIT count and how it is being used to inform conversations.
- Discussion was opened around the room.

- 28:08 **Katherine Fife Reviewed the Point in Time Count (PIT)**
Information was shared with the group about the upcoming PIT count on 1/25, 1/26, and 1/27/24. Volunteers are still needed, looking for about 200 more volunteers. It informs policy and funding for SLCo and nationally. Mayor Wilson reviewed the benefits of PIT count and incorporating substance use resources into conversations during PIT.
- Shawn McMillen updated the group on First Step House and their bed availability as well as sharing the volunteer opportunity.
- 35:33 **Legislative Preview**
Will Carlson and Rich Mauro presented on the upcoming legislation and bills that would affect SLCo. They reviewed bills that are being proposed in different categories that would impact the different stakeholders within CJAC. Presentation will be shared.
- 1:26:50 **Legislative Tracker**
Sebastian Green shared his preview of the Legislative Tracker currently being created. The goal of this tracker is to keep on top of upcoming bills that would impact Criminal Justice or Homeless services. The tracker is still in process but will be shared with the group once ready.
- 1:31:34 **High Utilizer Data Presentation**
Alexandra Allen presented on the data pulled to understand High Utilizers (frequent flyers), these individuals who were looked at are those who were booked in the jail (10 or more bookings) and self-disclosed that they are currently experiencing homelessness. This was reviewed to gain a better understanding of this specific population and their needs.

Alexandra Allen informed the group of the current status of the CJAC workgroups. The group was informed that we would like to review these work groups and collectively agree upon what is most pertinent to focus on and what work groups should be established to keep pushing CJAC forward. It was concluded that there will be a summary sent out to the group and review and comments will happen in the February meeting.
