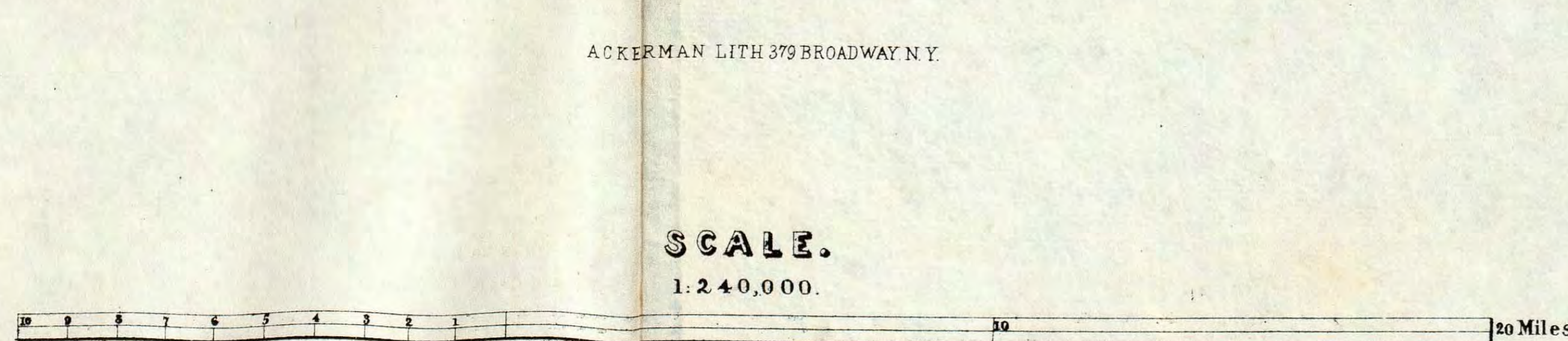


MAP

This desert consists of clay and sand impregnated with salt. When wet it has the consistency of mortar. Lightly loaded wagons can pass between Spring Valley and Blue Peak in the driest part of the season. Forcible and water must be carried for cattle and the journey begun in the P. M. and continued through the night. Distance between springs 70 mi.
